Program must provide near-term drought relief actions that

mitigate drought impacts for Tribes who are impacted by the

operation of a Reclamation water project. The Program's

objectives are to assist eligible Tribes to develop, manage and protect their water and related resources to mitigate the

adverse impacts of drought. To be consistent with the

purposes of the Act, proposals should meet one or more of

the following objectives: Mitigate drought impacts, Increase drought resiliency, Reduce reliance on declining water

sources,Increase the efficiency of water deliveries,Mitigate

the loss of water and related Tribal trust resources, or Address

drinking water shortages.
