governments in preparing to exercise or exercising STCJ over non-Indians who commit "covered" crimes within the Tribe's jurisdictional boundaries. "Covered crimes" are: assault of Tribal justice personnel; child violence;

dating violence; domestic violence; obstruction of justice; sexual violence; sex trafficking; stalking; and violation of a protection order. More information

on the scope and requirements of STCJ, including the pilot program for under which the Attorney General may designate Alaska Tribes to exercise STCJ over non-Indians who commit covered crimes in their Villages, is
