The primary goal of the Native American Resource Center (NARC) will be to enhance the knowledge about older adults in American Indian, Alaskan Native, and Native Hawaiin (Al/AN/NH), community, thereby increase and improve the delivery of services to elders. The NARC will focus on the development and provision of technical information.
